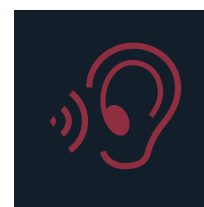


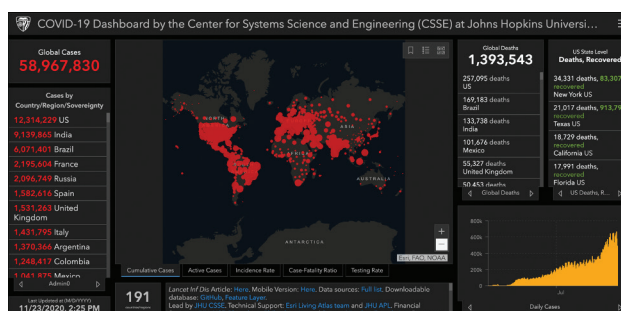

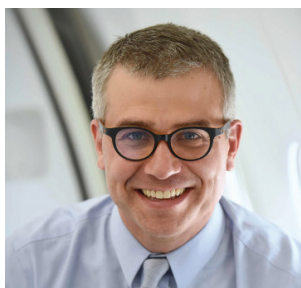
A GLOBAL COVID-19 DASHBOARD

The tool can be used to view cumulative cases, active cases, incidence rates, case-fatality ratios, and testing rates on a global map, and it includes links to the latest research published on the novel coronavirus.
