# A Botanically-based 2-Step System to Manage Seborrheic Dermatitis & Dandruff

eborrheic dermatitis (SD, commonly called dandruff) is a very common dermatologic disease characterized by flaking and scaling of the scalp. In fact, Americans reportedly spend more than \$520 million on dandruff shampoos annually. While it may not be a primary presentation at most dermatology clinics, many patients may ask about management options when they come to our offices. Because the most common OTC interventions may not be simple to use or may have unreliable efficacy, some frustrated patients do find their way to the dermatologist primarily to seek help for SD.

When confronted with SD, dermatologists may prescribe topical pharmacologic approaches, such as corticosteroids or antifungals. However, these are intended for short-term use and may be associated with risks for systemic exposure. Though not a significant risk, this systemic exposure may be concerning for otherwise healthy patients. Additionally, SD and dandruff interventions are not always aesthetically pleasing.

To simplify management, dermatologists are interested in a regimen that's easy to use and fits the patient's lifestyle. New products from Kamedis may fit this niche.

### ABOUT THE KAMEDIS 2-STEP SYSTEM WITH BOTANIPLEX

The Kamedis 2-step system visibly reduces scaling by hydrating the scalp as well as the hair. The Kamedis 2 Step System includes a Step 1 pre-treatment scalp lotion that is applied to dry or damp scalp before bedtime, or at least 15 minutes prior to shampooing, and a Step



2 shampoo that cleanses and treats. The shampoo is cosmetically elegant and works up to a good lather; It is suitable for daily use—even as part of a morning routine. Both products contain a small amount of zinc pyrithione, a proven treatment for seborrheic dermatitis, and both contain botanicals, including indigo (*Indigofera tinctoria* extract), that has a history of use ethnobotanically to treat redness, itching, and scaling on human skin. Other botanical ingredients include *Sapindus mukorossifruit* extract, *Rheum palmatum* extract, *Portulaca oleracea* extract, *Phellodendron amurense* bark extract, and *Angelica polymorpha* sinensis root extract. These are all agents included in the OTC monograph as safe for use. In addition to calming properties, these ingredients impart a pleasant, botanical fragrance.

A benefit of the two-step system is that it is very easy for patients to use. Patients simply get a good lather going, leave it in as long as they can (while cleansing the rest of the body, for example), and then rinse it out. Patients may use a hair conditioner product after shampooing, if they wish, but this is not necessary. Application of the lotion to the scalp is as simple as dispensing some product from the tube, rubbing it into the scalp, and then combing it through. The lotion is non-staining and non-drying, so patients don't have to fret over damaged sheets or an uncomfortable-feeling product in the hair.





extracts or components.

Not only is this intriguing from a medical science standpoint, but it is also appealing to many healthcare consumers.
